Rocky investigates ICU at Santa Clara Valley Medical Center, Uncovers Physical Therapist torture ring.

On Saturday September 28th Steve "Rocky" Miller was cutting wood with his next door neighbor in SLO early Saturday when a large (2,000#) limb fell on him. It took a while for a medical team to get to him, stabilize the limb, and dig him out. He never lost consciousness.

Part of his right hand and pelvic area were crushed no doubt in an attempt to protect those most vital areas. In extreme pain he was sent first to French Hospital, then Sierra Vista and finally flown to Santa Clara Valley Medi-

cal late Sunday.

His pelvis is split down the middle but not crushed, hence the surgery involving a plate. That blow could have resulted in much worse.

His wife, Karen is with him and is staying in the Bay Area with a friend.

Doctors have inserted two pins in the right hand and operated twice on the poor guy. Physical Therapy started on October 6th, just a couple of days after one operation.

There is a committee forming to break Rocky out of the Hospital and get him closer to home where he can begin recovery.

Several SF Bay Area Brothers listening to the Giants game heard announcer Mike Krukow sent out his best wishes to Rocky.

Meanwhile a new nickname is in the works — 2 leading entries are: "Man of Steel" and "Paul Bunyan"

He has been battling serious diabetes and a burst appendix. He's had two operations and spent half of September in ICU with only family contact allowed and no phone access.

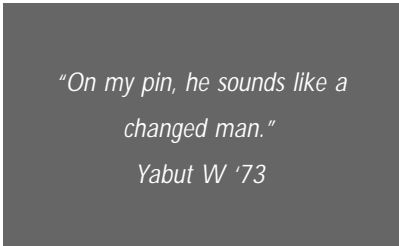
Good news! The Son-Of-A-Bitch is going to live!

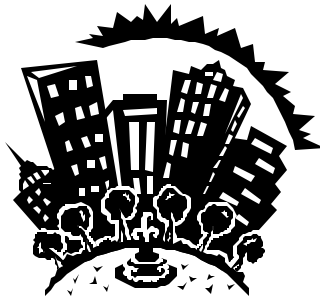
Regional Alumni Leaders Needed To help locate the lost
