"Epsilon Rho Alum Tapped For Grand Council"

Brother Jim "Lurch" Larson, a 1972 initiate, was recently honored by being asked by National President Mike Hoffman and Executive Director Scott Wiley to step into an empty seat on the Fraternity's Grand Council. He is the first initiate of Epsilon Rho to hold this National distinction.



While an undergraduate member of the fraternity, Lurch served as Rush Chairman, Treasurer, and President. He was active in a number of additional campus activities, including IFC President, WOW Counselor, and Army ROTC. Jim graduated with Honors in 1975 with a degree in Business and completed his MBA at Cal Poly in 1976. He has been married to former Dream Girl Greta Beetstra for 33 years and they have three children. Their son, James III, is an orthopedic surgeon in Pittsburgh. Their older daughter Jessica has returned to school and is completing her double Masters at Loyola University in Chicago. Their younger daughter Ashley is a member of Delta Delta Delta sorority and a junior majoring in Biological Science at the University of

Wisconsin in Madison.

Jim and Greta now live in Wisconsin, where he is the Global Head of Human Resources for JohnsonDiversey, a worldwide leader in sustainable industrial cleaning and sanitation solutions. The company has 11,000 employees in 60 countries. Prior to joining his current company, he spent 26 years in various roles in Human Resources including Executive Vice President of HR for InterContinental Hotels and the Global Leader of HR for Kelloggs. When not working he divides his time between volunteering for a number of ministries at his local parish, golfing, and fly-fishing as often as possible with his son and a couple of equally interested fraternity brothers. Previous to joining the Grand Council, Jim's service to the Fraternity included being a Deputy District Governor for the Fraternity when he lived in Texas and coordination of the 1983 National Convention held in Dallas. He is also a member of Delta Sigma Phi's 1899 Society which aggregates alumni donations to enable undergraduate leadership development. He has been active with the Epsilon Rho ACB and even though his jobs have taken him away from California, including five years in Europe, he continues to return to Cal Poly most years for the Carnation Ball and ACB meeting.

The Grand Council is responsible for creating the Fraternity's long-term vision and multi-year strategic plan. It also manages the annual objectives for the Executive Director and his team. The Council holds itself accountable for driving our growth, strengthening our chapters, building alumni support, and ensuring financial viability.

With his appointment to the Council he brings his years of experience in people-development to support the Fraternity's continuing bold initiative to "Build Better Men." The Council is committed to providing an opportunity for our members to develop themselves as brothers, students, and citizens. Jim wants to create an unparalleled personal development and education system at the undergraduate level. He intends to define a recognizable difference between Delta Sigma Phi and other fraternities. Creating a competitive advantage in recruitment and retention of the highest quality men will promote Fraternity growth. He believes these tools will help attract and build better men for today's chapters and also promotes the Fraternity's long term sustainability by generating more capable and successful alumni.

Jim is appointed to this role until this July when he will stand for election to a four year term. His on-going responsibilities include attending quarterly two-day planning and operations meetings at Fraternity headquarters, monthly conference calls, attending leadership training sessions for undergraduates, and representing the Fraternity at ceremonial events across the country. As with other Council members, he is a volunteer who serves without compensation and pays his own way.

Since joining the Grand Council Lurch has learned that the vast majority of successful active chapters have strong and involved alumni teams that provide guidance, leadership, and counsel. He is excited to be able to Repay His Debt to Delta Sigma Phi for the tremendous lessons he learned as an undergraduate and the amazing influence the Fraternity has had on every part of his life.

Alumni support is absolutely critical and while he knows we're all busy he would urge all his fellow Epsilon Rho brothers to find a way to stay connected, provide support, and remember the

great times and tremendous learning we all experienced as fraternity brothers in Delta Sigma Phi. We can donate our time, our minds, or our funds - the Fraternity needs them all. He urges Epsilon Rho brothers to become involved in some manner.

In the words of one of the great leaders of the Fraternity, Dr. Charles Tonsor,
"It's not what we gain ,but what we give, that measures the value of the life we live".



ACB President's Message "The Changing Greek System"



On December 2, 2008, a member of SAE fraternity in San Luis Obispo died due to acute alcohol poisoning. As you might suspect, the Greek system in SLO is again under intense scrutiny. Our Epsilon Rho Chapter is being held up as a gleaming example of leadership and what the support of an active alumni base can do for a chapter in providing leadership and guidance to young men. Your ACB members have been in close contact with the Active Chapter and the University to ensure our chapter continues to provide leadership opportunities for young men, and to guide the University Policymakers through this challenging time.

In November our chapter was rocked with unsupported allegations of the use of "date rape" drugs on unsuspecting co-eds. The chapter executive board was called before the school and over 50 members attended this ad-hoc meeting called by the Greek Affairs leader Stephan Lamb. The concern of our members and the quick reaction of alumni as a unit showed the University that Epsilon Rho was willing to examine itself to ensure it was not putting any student in danger. The chapter and the ACB immediately executed a membership review by an independent outside consultant in concert with the National Organization. I am pleased to report that we found without a question that these accusations were not related to members of the fraternity. ACB soon followed up with the University with our findings and corrective action plans to ensure that students are not put at risk. The National organization has seen our quick reaction as an excellent example of what an involved alumni base can do to guide young men into becoming responsible leaders.

Your ACB continues to work tirelessly to ensure the undergraduates at Cal Poly SLO have a top notch house and are leaders on campus and in the community. Our chapter continues to grow, change, and evolve in an era of higher academic requirements. Please take the time to volunteer for one of many positions to support the chapter and guide young men into tomorrow's leadership.

Our chapter members remain an example of leadership on campus with involvement in government, IFC sports, academic clubs, and in the community with philanthropy. The Chapter and ACB finances remain solid as we build a chapter replacement fund.

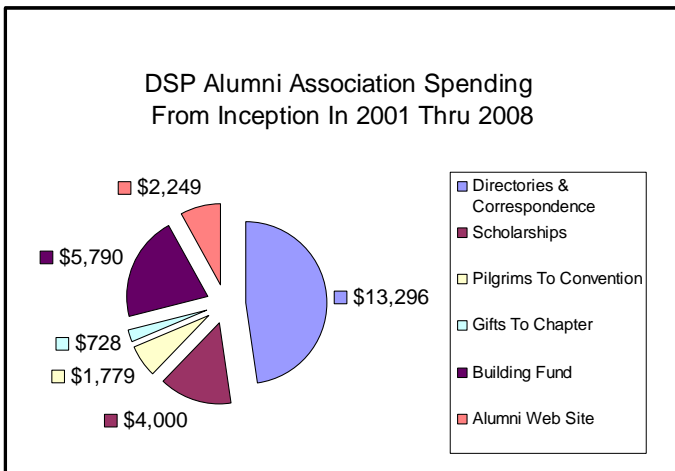


Alumni Association Report

Chapter History

“Part I - In The Beginning”

The history of the Epsilon Rho Chapter of the Delta Sigma Phi National Social Fraternity at Cal

Poly is unique! We were the first national social fraternity at Cal Poly, a colony longer than any other in Fraternity history, and a larger colony than many chapters! As the Summer 1969 edition of the CARNATION exclaimed:



“The oldest colony in the Fraternity, and perhaps in any fraternity, became a chapter in ceremonies April 26 (1969) in San Luis Obispo, California, as the nearly 20-year-old Calpoly (sic) colony was chartered as Epsilon Rho of Delta Sigma Phi.”

Delta Sigma Phi National became interested in the then California Polytechnic College in 1949 as a result of the college’s receiving full academic accreditationⁱ of four year degree programs on December 11, 1948.

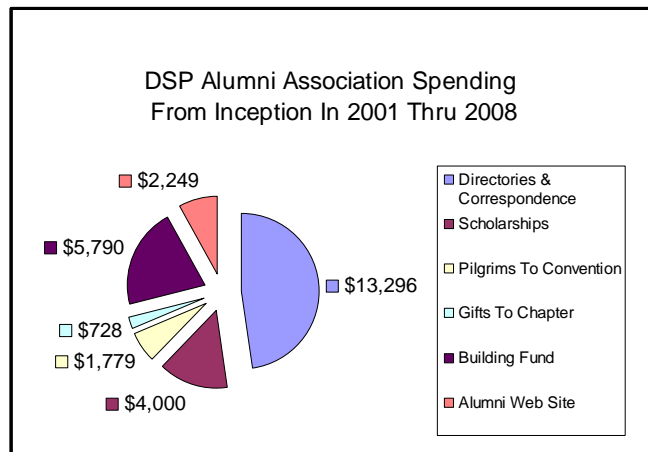
